**B****Metric Conversion Guide**

The conversion of existing measurements into SI values should retain the level of precision obtained in the original measurement. Table 1 provides conversion equivalents.

The number of decimal places required for any unit, of course, depends upon the nature of the investigation and the magnitude of the unit itself. Detailed instructions are given in the Canadian Metric Practice Guide.
